According to the Wycliffe Global Alliance, as of Sept. 2023, the whole of the Bible has been translated into 736 languages so far, and the New Testament into an additional 1,658. Smaller translations of the Bible have also been translated into 1,264 other languages. Opposition to Bible translation for the general public cost John Wycliffe his life, but happily for many billions of people since, there were others willing to take up the challenge! However, there are 7,000 different languages spoken in the world today. It seems that the translators will never be out of a job! So it's time to look at our first reading today from –

DEUTERONOMY 34; 1-18

Reflection

The eventual rescue of the Israelites from Egypt came through both human and divine means although the human (Moses) wasn't too sure of his credentials at first! His life was also safe and fairly comfortable. But he learnt to trust God and for the next 40 years, through all the wanderings and faithlessness and failures of the people (and a few mistakes of his own!) the faith and love of God's servant Moses only grew in strength. He was known as Israel's greatest prophet and yet he himself never did enter the Promised Land. However, God did give him an extraordinary vision of it before the baton was passed on to Joshua.

Prayers of Confession

Sovereign God, we know that you are so much greater than our human minds can fathom, able to achieve things far beyond our imaginations, working in ways that defy all expectations. Forgive us when we lose sight of who you are and what you can do; When we see things from a human rather than divine perspective and fail to grasp opportunities you offer us because we forget that what is impossible for us alone, is possible with you beside us. Help us always to put you first in our lives, even when it means putting our own interests second. So may your love be shown and your kingdom brought a little closer. Amen.

READ MATTHEW 22;34-46

The Pharisees take quite a lot of criticism from Jesus and not surprisingly they are keen to get their own back. Jesus was a threat to their traditional understanding of the Law. But this last attempt to trap Jesus was no more successful than the previous ones. The question as to which is the greatest commandment in the Law is answered in a way the Pharisees couldn't possibly disagree with, even if they wanted to. "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind" After all, loving God and commitment to doing his will is what the Pharisees claimed to live by. Jesus is implying that there can be no true love of God without love of neighbour. (which can be construed as a dig at those who view the legalities of the Law, as love of God - over and above compassion for the people!) Interestingly, Deuteronomy 6;5 (where we first find this Law) states "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all the soul and with all your strength" I wonder, did Jesus purposely change "strength" for "mind" perhaps suggesting

they ought to be thinking a little more deeply at the purpose of the Law?

So Jesus not only answers their questions satisfactorily, he also puts one of his own to them (v41) as he quotes Psalm 110;1

Although Jesus has never refused the title "son of David" he is claiming here to be much more than that, much more than a human being, even if that human being is of royal blood! The Pharisees knew what Jesus was inferring and were unable (or unwilling?) to answer, so they went away and plotted against him.

Jesus knew the scriptures well. He would have grown up memorising them from a small boy. He would have read Deuteronomy 20;16 that taught, "In those towns that the Lord your God is giving you as a special possession, destroy every living thing!" - And 1 Samuel 15;2-3 ""This is what the Lord of Heavens armies has declared; I have decided to settle accounts with the nation of Amelek for opposing Israel when they came from Egypt – now go and completely destroy the entire Amalekite nation – men, women, children, babies, cattle, sheep goats, camels and donkeys! (We don't often talk about these things in church!)

As human beings on the journey of life, we don't always get it right. We allow fear, pride, desire for power and even ignorance to get in the way. In the recent past, certain passages of the Bible have been used to sanction medieval witch hunts and justify slavery and apartheid. Or to wield power over the more vulnerable or less educated. It is still used today by some to exclude women from leadership and ministry in the Church, to oppress gay people and to destroy the environment.

But for all the negatives, there are far more positives. The teachings and example of Jesus that we learn about from the Bible, was the major influencer of the abolition of slavery and apartheid; of social services, schooling, medical care and charitable work, the adoption and fostering of children and the abolition of child labour. We even have Christianity to thank for our holidays (holy days!)

And of course, now that winter is looming, Warm Spaces are back on the agenda. Created as a

response to the Cost of Living Crisis, and soaring energy bills, the Warm Welcome Campaign supported more than 7,000 warm spaces last winter, with around half of them run by churches. As a result, an impact evaluation found that Warm Welcome Spaces not only reduced chronic loneliness amongst guests from almost 40% to just 6%, it fostered relationships!

And so for me, the most important thing the Bible gives us is Jesus. Jesus for me is the decisive revelation of God, disclosing what a life filled with God looks like. And it isn't about keeping to the letter of the Law. Rather, it's about how we live out the liberating, life-affirming, healing, good news of Christ in the world today. So let's pray
