Bible reflections:

Galatians 4:4-7

But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children. And because you are children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, 'Abba! Father!' So you are no longer a slave but a child, and if a child then also an heir, through God. This passage reminds us that God came in Jesus 'when the time had fully come' (AV), implying that in that window of relative peace, safe travel and a shared language the good news of Jesus could travel far and wide.

Think how God has led you in your lives, how God's grace has been seen among your family and friends. Give thanks to God for coming is Jesus, and being with us now.

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Luke 2:25-40

This passage is the presentation of Jesus at the temple according to the Jewish rites at the birth of a boy. Mary and Joseph have resources only for the simplest offering.


But they are met by Simeon and Anna who have waited long for the coming of the Lord's Messiah. Simeon is guided by the Holy Spirit and Anna through prayer recognise the holy family.

Simeons song includes the phrase: 'for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,

a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel.'

- *Reflect on the way the light of Christ is present with you now.*
- Do you recognise this light in other people?
- Make a Christingle and pray that all people will know the light of Christ.
 - We recall Mary and Joseph were displaced people and in a borrowed stable Jesus was born.
 - We pray for all or all those who live in the darkness of violence and war.
 - We pray the light of justice and peace may guide the leaders of the nations.
 - We pray for all who seek to bring aid and shelter to vulnerable people.
- You may wish to make the Christingle with family, friends or guests.

Christingle - The Light of Christ for all



You will need an orange, four soft sweets, four cocktail sticks, a red ribbon to go round the orange and a candle. Make your Christingle as you read the sections below and give thanks to God and pray for others as you do it.

The idea of Christingles came from a Moravian Church in Germany in 1747. The minister, John de Watteville, gave children a lighted candle with a red ribbon around it. This represented Jesus being the light of the world and the final prayer of that first service was 'Lord Jesus, kindle a flame in these children's hearts, that theirs like Thine become'.

The Christingle simply expresses the way God came in Jesus to be with us, and by his death and resurrection, to offer us a transformed life.

God created the world and he loved it, especially the children he made in his own image to live in it.

Take an orange.

God filled the earth with good things for all people to enjoy and share in very part of the world. *Take four soft sweets on four cocktail sticks and place them facing four ways.*

But people were (are) selfish and do not share with each other and didn't love God the way God loved them. They pollute the planet, abuse its resources, seek to exert power over others rather than serve them.

That is when the person who changed everything stepped in. God came in Jesus, the light of the world, to show the way of love.

Place your unlit candle in the top of the orange.

He lived his life in a totally different way that shone brightly. And then, he gave it away, dying for us so we would all know his love fully, and receive his strength to love God and each other.

Wrap a red ribbon round the orange at the 'equator'. Light the candle and give thanks for all God in Christ has done for all. Use this prayer:

Let us receive the light of Christ in our lives, give thanks for all the good things we have; rejoice in God's love and grace for all; cheerfully pray, speak out and give so that many more people can share in God's goodness and his love. **Amen**
